



Commemorate: 15 years since the **SREBRENICA MASSACRE**

“Never again, never forget”

SATURDAY 10 JULY 11 am - 1 pm

In Whitehall, opposite 10 Downing St

In July 1995 United Nations soldiers in the UN-declared "safe area" of Srebrenica in Bosnia Herzegovina allowed the enclave to fall to besieging nationalist Serbs.

The UN soldiers handed over 8000 Muslim men and boys to the Bosnian Serb army, headed by General Ratko Mladic.

They were systematically slaughtered, along with many more who tried to escape the area through the forest on foot.

It was the most unspeakable episode of the genocidal war launched by the nationalist Serbs against the people of Bosnia-Herzegovina during 1992-1995.

- **End the division of Bosnia-Herzegovina**
- **Abolish Republika Srpska**
- **Bring Mladic to justice**

Today Bosnia-Herzegovina remains divided along ethnic lines as a result of the Dayton agreement imposed by western governments.

The establishment of Republika Sprska (which takes up 49 per cent of Bosnia) rewarded the nationalist Serbs for their violent war of aggression.

The International War Crimes Tribunal brought the "architect of genocide", Serbian president Slobodan Milosevic to trial in 2002 but allowed him to drag the court case out over five years.

He died before judgement could be given. The NATO bombing which brought the war to an end in 1995 and enabled western governments

to impose the Dayton agreement also meant that Milosovic could portray himself during his trial as a victim and a hero who stood up to NATO aggression.

The NATO intervention did not arise from humanitarian motives, as is often claimed. It followed victories by combined Bosnian & Croat forces in the war, when it became clear that the Bosnian people were capable of defeating their enemy and deciding their own destiny.

Radovan Karadzic (the Bosnian Serb leader indicted, like Milosevic for genocide) is using his current trial in a similar fashion - but Ratko Mladic, who headed the Bosnian Serb army has been 15 years on the run, and still remains free.

We demand that the UK government use its influence to:

1. Expedite Karadzic's trial
2. Find Mladic and ensure his prosecution for his role in the genocidal massacre at Srebrenica.
3. Abolish Republika Srpska and reunite Bosnia
